New in the Church Library

Knowing the Song by Colin Gibson. This book is a companion to the collections of New Zealand hymns published by the NZ Hymnbook Trust, including *Alleluia Aotearoa*, *Faith Forever Singing*, *Hope is Our Song*, and the NZ Supplement to the hymnbook *With One Voice*. We use all of these collections at St Andrew's. Each of the hymns has a listing which includes background information about the hymn, including its origin and context where available. Often the writers themselves are quoted, explaining how the hymn came to be written. Information about the tunes and their origin is also given. Another section of the companion gives short biographies of all the hymn writers and composers and arrangers of the music.
