

He Tatau Pounamu: The Treaty of Waitangi - A Covenant of Reconciliation by Alistair



Reese. The writer asserts that the Treaty of Waitangi is a 'kawenata', a covenant, a sacred compact, with three voices, that of the leaders of the tribes (the rangatira), the voice of the representative of the British Crown, and the Churches' spokespeople – witnesses to the Unseen, the Holy Spirit. Dr Reese gives discerning insights into the background and original intention of the Treaty – very relevant at a time of national debate, when we need to consider the common origins of our life together and make decisions going forward into the future. This is a compact, easy to read account, endorsed by Archbishop, Sir David Moxon.

Taizé is a community in France where thousands of people gather each week, to spend time in prayer and song. Taizé chants use short simple sacred phrases and are sung in four-part harmonies in many languages. The exquisite harmonies and discords create a meditative quality, and sung well, create one of those 'wow' moments. (You do not need to be able to read music to take part.)

The workshop leader is Sue Gilmer, who has visited Taizé several times, and regularly runs workshops.
